2022 Survey - highlights

70% (n=569) click through rate and a 63% (n=513) engagement rate.

Response rates varied from 6% to 100%. Average of 69%.

66% (n=335) had an RCS as their first choice, 97% had it high on their list.

72% (n=365) would strongly recommend the RCS experience.

2023 Timeline

All admins of record have been emailed link to gather contact data and preferred survey times.

3 new questions added to survey and COVID questions removed.

New survey has been submitted to ethics as an amendment – aiming for approval ASAP.

First surveys out in May – last surveys out early December.

Early 2024 cleaning of data and sending of de-identified data to Heads of programs and RCS.

Work towards getting both CSU and Curtin involved to enable us to have almost comprehensive coverage of all regional/rural training options.

- Involvement in a rural club in pre clinical as an indicator of rural preference for practice. (Historical data)
- Who changes? Looking at the change in preferences pre and post RCS exposure and is there a type? (Historical data)
- Does involvement in a rural community increase intention to go rural? (New survey question)

- End to end training and its impact on rural intention (New survey question)
- Access to teaching in rural placement hospitals (New survey question)
- Motivating factors for taking up a rural pathway (New survey question)
- How have medical students' opinions on their mental wellness changed over 10 years (20112-2022)? (Historical data)
- How have medical students' opinions on their mental wellness changed since COVID 2019 pandemic? (Historical data)
