




Objectives

- Improve the coordination to enable students to complete as much of their medical training as possible in rural areas;
- Identify students & facilitate access to networked rural training opportunities at an early stage;
- Develop regional training capacity;
- Strengthen existing, and develop new, connections to improve continuity of training within the region; and
- Identify regional medical workforce needs & thus prioritise activity.
- Outcome: to increase the size of a well-prepared rural & remote medical workforce.







Inputs

 Description (& typology if appropriate) of nature & cost of regional training hubs.



Activities

- Number & nature of collaborations to support the integration of medical training : health services, state & territory governments, universities, colleges, postgraduate medical councils, local health practitioners, RTOs, PHNs
- Building regional training capacity including: assisting health services in accreditation processes for new posts; supporting local health professionals to become supervisors;
- Identification of medical students with an interest in rural practice & support provided including assistance with career planning, placement opportunities, mentoring.



Outputs

- Description of *new regional medical training capacity*;
- Description of *regional medical workforce needs and priorities* within the catchment area;
- Quantification and description of the training placements available at each level of the medical training continuum within each hub's region of activity and changes over time.



Outcomes

- Improved recruitment & retention of medical graduates & specialists to rural & remote areas;
- Descriptions of *lessons learned* from the regional training hubs initiative;
- Economic analysis of return on investment.
